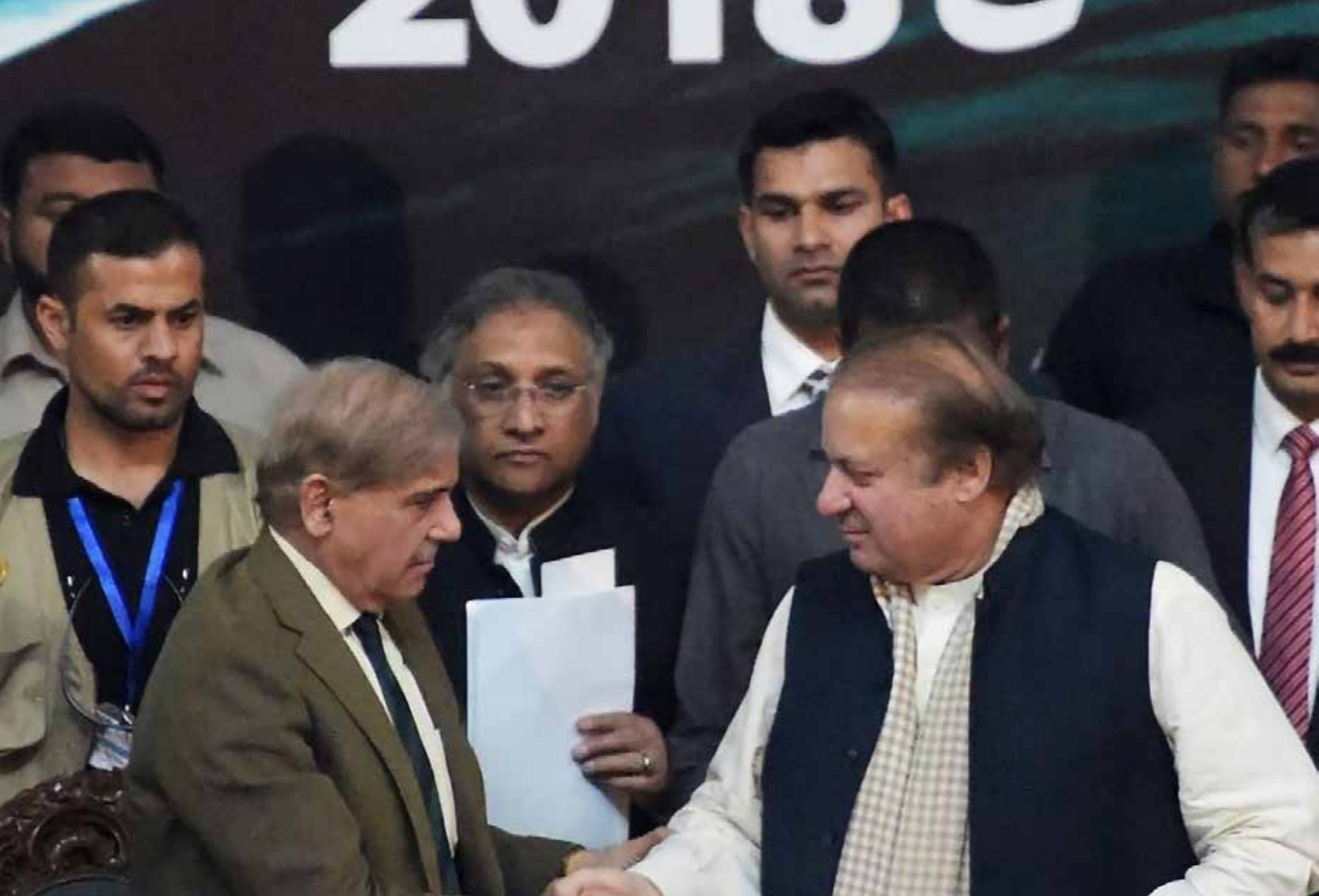


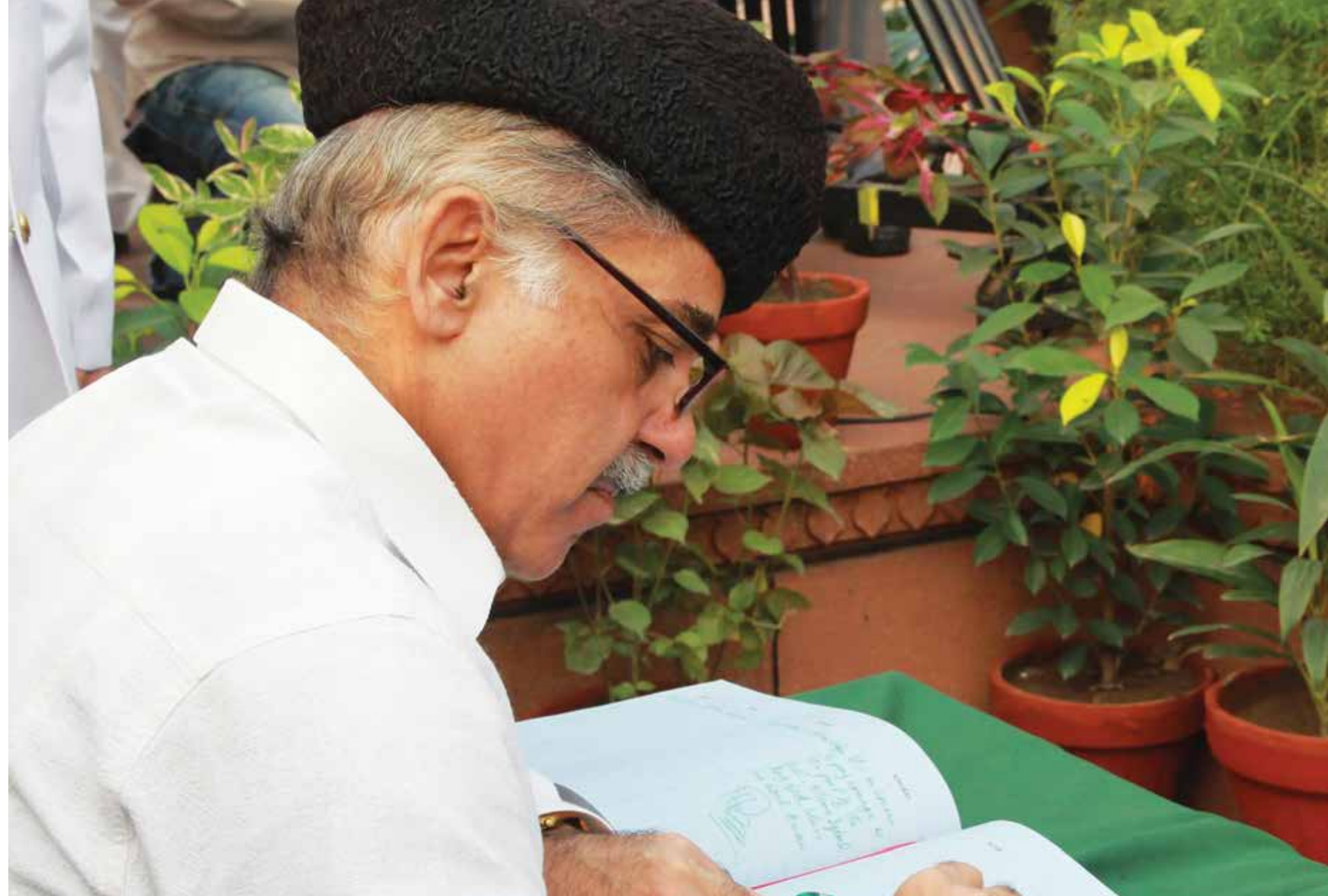






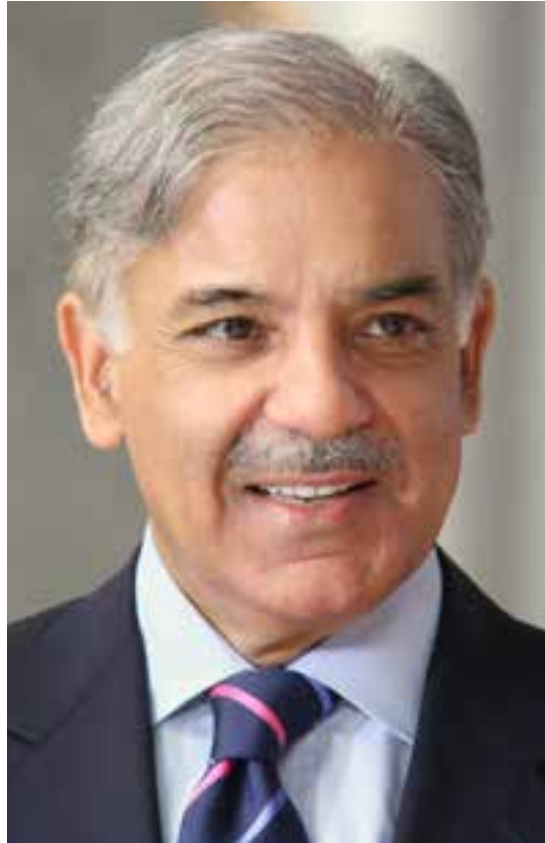












Politics, for me, has been an instrument of public service. It is not an end in itself but a means to an end, which is to serve the people. When I stepped into the political arena many decades ago, I had vowed to leave a legacy of dedicated service aimed at improving the living conditions of the people. While there have been many ups and downs in my public service career, when I look back, I am happy to have contributed my bit in the line of duty.

One of the foundational pillars of both society and the economy is the health sector, primarily because it is the fundamental right of citizens. However, delivering access to quality healthcare has always been a challenge in Pakistan because of the scarce resources and the increasing needs of the populace. Which is why I took it upon myself to introduce path-breaking reforms in the health sector that not only improved the hardware in terms of the establishment of new health facilities but also the software whereby the system, policies and performance were upgraded and periodically audited.

Health

Mian Shehbaz Sharif as Chief Minister Punjab introduced a number of initiatives in health sector. These initiatives achieved widespread recognition not only in Pakistan but also internationally. Even the World Health Organization (WHO) tweeted on June 6, 2018: “well done Punjab”, and publicly acclaimed the outstanding performance of the Government of Punjab in strengthening the immunisation for improving the health of children, particularly in controlling and curtailing deadly diseases. These initiatives not only protected the lives of hundreds of thousands of children but had also promoted the welfare of the general public by providing them access to quality healthcare and good educational facilities, essential ingredients that were not there in the past.

- Increased health budget by 500 per cent.
- Mobile health units have been launched in remote districts of Punjab.
- Four new medical colleges set up in Sialkot, Sahiwal and D.G.Khan.

- Hepatitis Ordinance 2017 was implemented and Hepatitis clinics were established in 100 district hospitals.

- A performance appreciation system was launched along with the Sehat Khidmat Award.

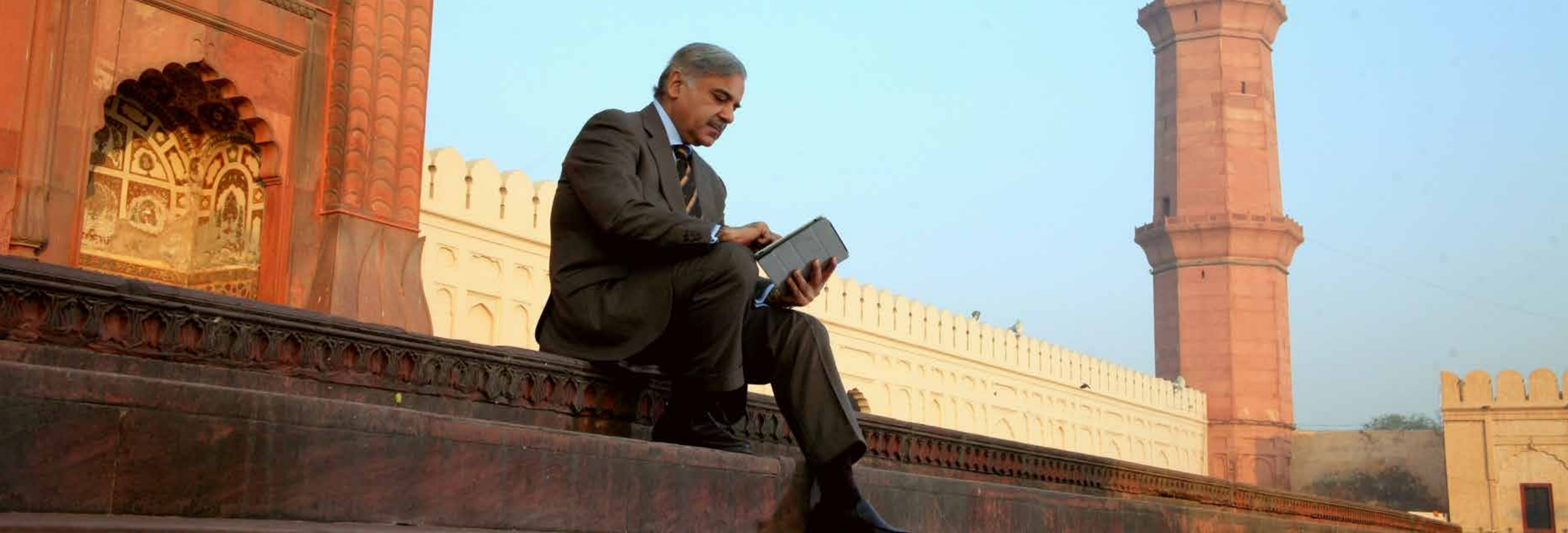

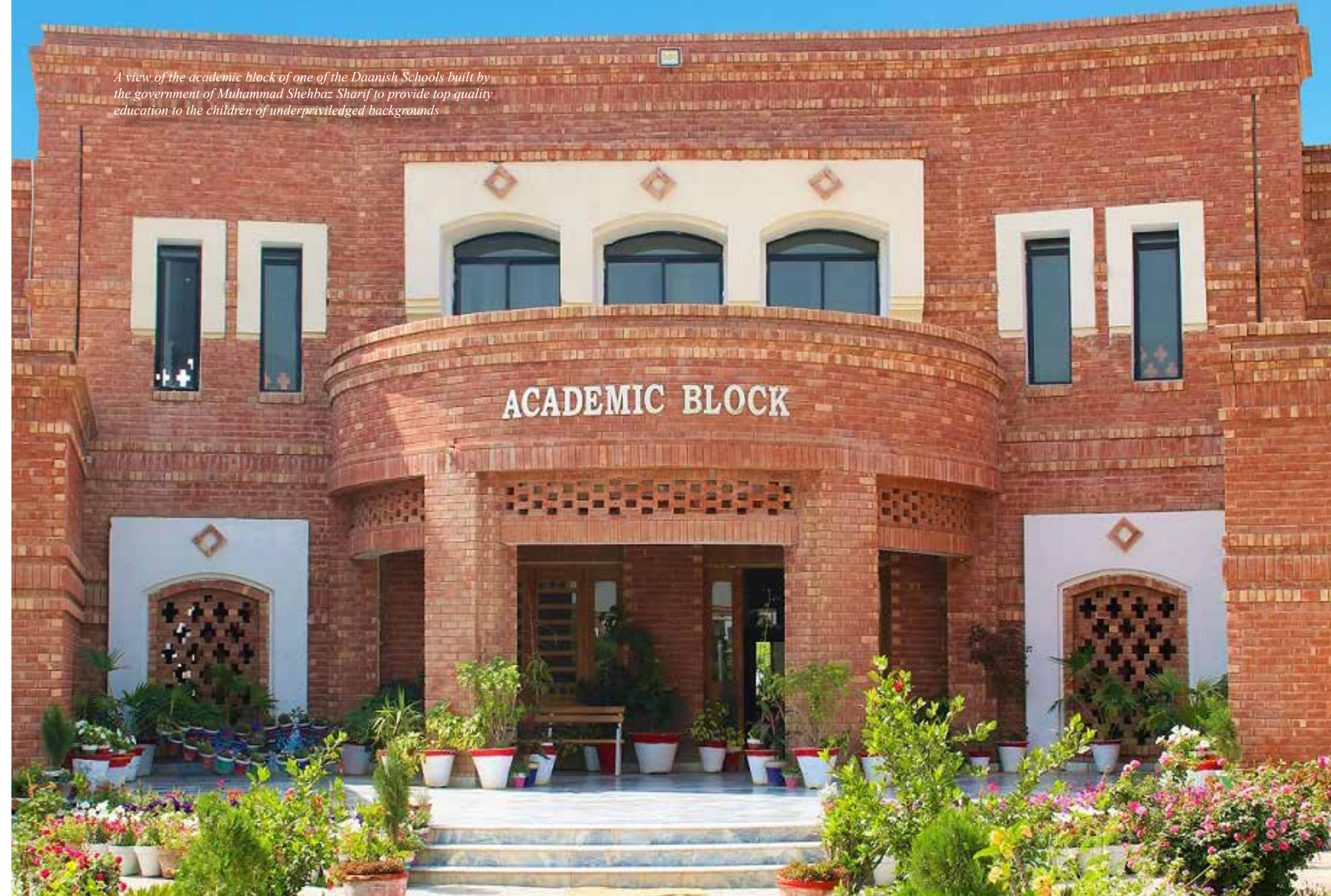
Education

Education had been a key priority area. Schemes like Daanish Schools at six locations and distribution of 125,000 laptops to top students are unique initiatives in nature as these aimed at providing equal opportunity to children from low income families. Other activities include establishment of IT labs in 4,286 schools, initiation of Punjab Educational Endowment Fund, recruitment of teachers through competitive examinations on open merit. In Vocational & Technical Education, the provincial capacity has more than doubled during the tenure of Shehbaz Sharif as Chief Minister Punjab in the last two years and now over 130,000 skilled workers are getting jobs annually.

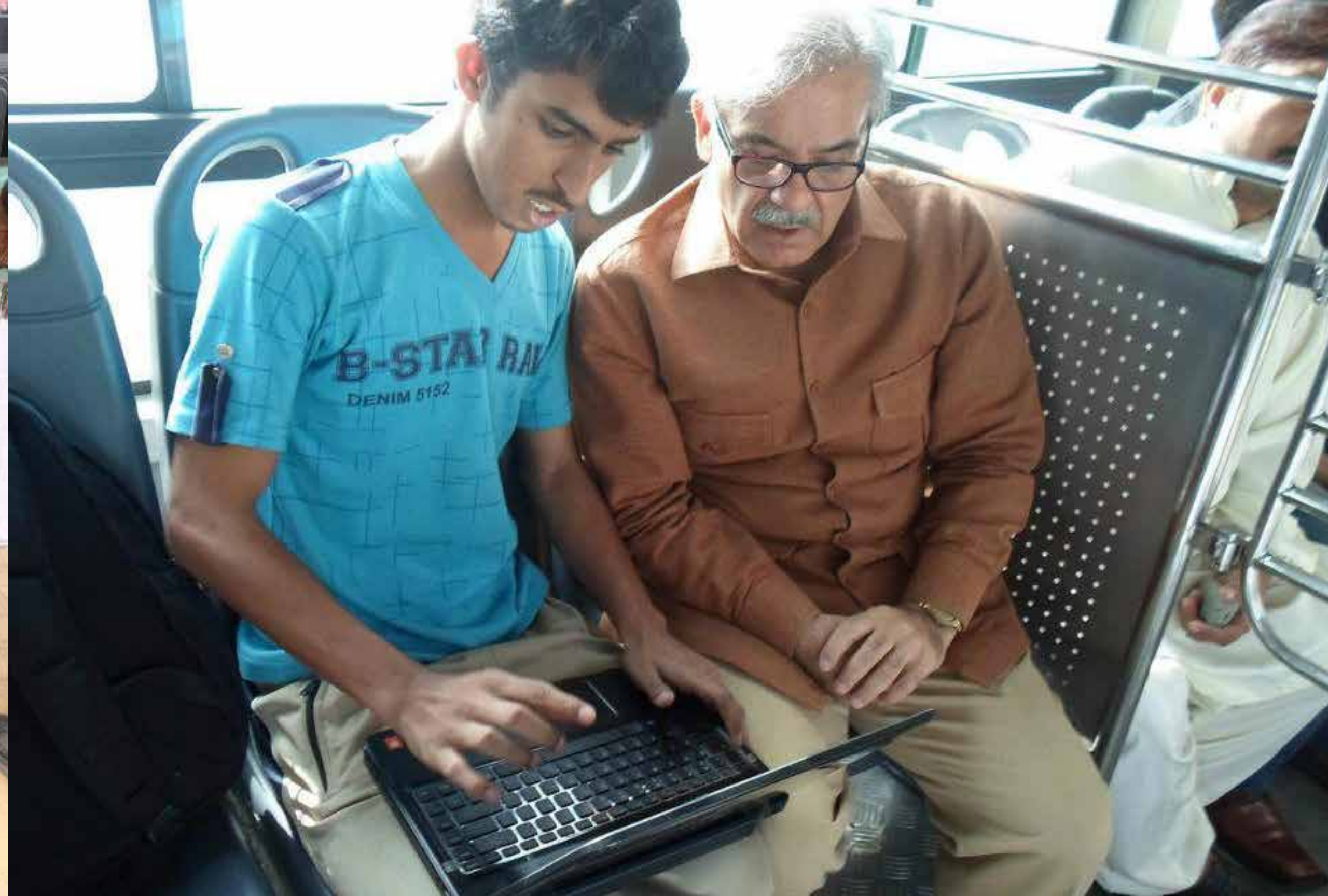

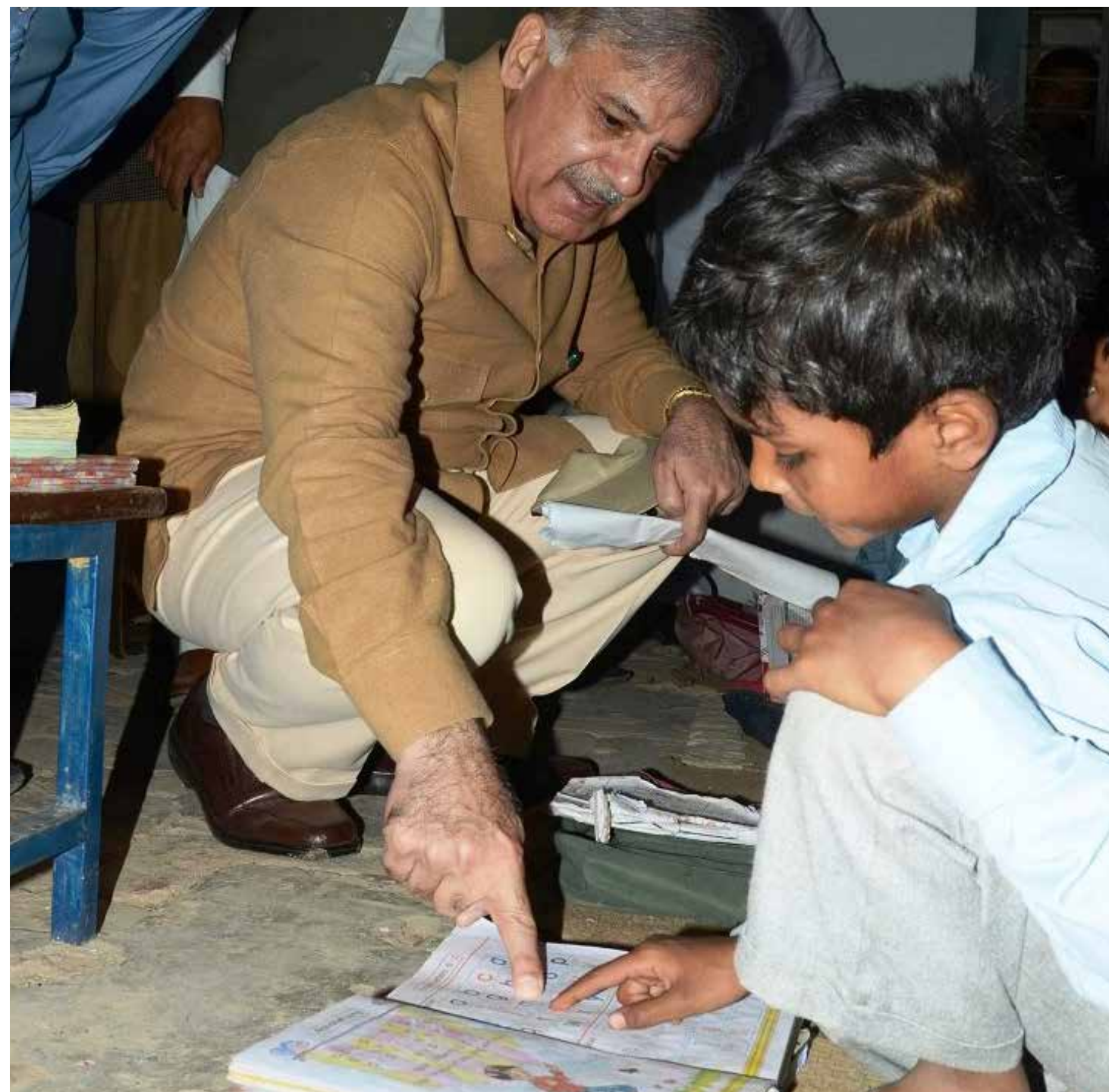

Energy

Pakistan was facing sever energy crisis along with Punjab, having highest population, was the worst-hit region. In a short span of four years, the Punjab Government has been able to add about 3,200-MW to the national grid. Massive power production projects launched by Shehbaz Sharif in Punjab were even acknowledged as unprecedented by development giants like China and Turkey. Under the Khadim-e-Punjab Ujala Program (KPUP), he planned solarising 20,000 public schools in Punjab, out of which 10,861 schools in South Punjab were solarised.

A mega program of construction and rehabilitation of rural roads under Khadim-e-Punjab Rural Roads Program worth of Rs. 150 billion was launched to develop the rural infrastructure and to help bring prosperity for the village-dwellers. “Pakian Sarkan Sokhay Painday” Program emerged as a game-changer initiative for the rural economy as it has benefited every segment of the society living there. Mass Transit

The Punjab government under Shehbaz Sharif's leadership took state of the art initiatives in revolutionizing the mass transit sector. During his second tenure, he initiated a rapid urban transportation project in Lahore namely Lahore Metrobus. The project started operating in 2013 and has 27 stations along a 27 km corridor that stretches from Shahdara to Gajumata in Lahore. He started two further metro networks one in Rawalpindi, Rawalpindi-Islamabad Metrobus and the other in Multan Metrobus under China-Pakistan Economic Corridor. Shehbaz Sharif also started the metro railway system in Lahore commonly known as Orange Line (Lahore Metro). The first phase of the project was started in October 2015, while in October 2016, Phase 2 of the project and now it has become fully operational and millions of people are benefiting from it.

Agriculture

In the agricultural sector, policy reforms like the Reform Agriculture Marketing Legislation by introducing Agriculture Marketing Bill, 2011 and Establishment of Agriculture Marketing Information System (AMIS) to create awareness agricultural markets. Under Shehbaz Sharif's chief ministership government policies allowed private sector to establish agriculture produce markets to attract investment in this sector. This encouraged establishment of cool chain and modern storage facilities coupled with the steps taken to introduce the concept of commodity future markets in agriculture. A new incentive package was announced for the agriculture sector to improve the terms of trade for the sector by ensuring that the prices paid by the farmers for inputs were in line with the prices they received for their crops.

Security of life and Property

In a bid to ensure the security of life and property of the people, Punjab Government constituted Counter Terrorism Force equipped with modern training and its first contingent had taken over its responsibilities. The role of Counter Terrorism Force is of national importance. Dolphin Force was established to be an elite security unit of the Punjab Police, it was established to deal with street crimes. Modeled after the Istanbul Police Dolphin Force, it was launched by the Chief Minister of Punjab Shehbaz Sharif in Lahore in 2016. It was later expanded to five other cities of the province. About 696 policemen trained in the second phase.

Considering the Safe Cities idea and to address the security difficulties of a cutting edge urban condition, a self-governing authority was set up under the Punjab Safe Cities Ordinance 2015 for the improvement, establishment and maintenance of Integrated Command and Control Communications Program across all over the Punjab. The Ordinance was drafted and endorsed on July 7, 2015, with its overseeing body, official and the executive's arrangement. It was chosen to name a full-time Managing Director with talented staff to successfully deal with the undertakings of the Authority. Safe City Project was fully operational in mega cities within a short period of time.

Youth and Women Development

Punjab Government undertook remarkable initiatives for the development of youth and women development under the chief ministership of Shehbaz Sharif.

The Government of Punjab launched the “Student Green Card” scheme on 7th July, 2012. This Card allows students of Government institutions to travel on LTC buses at flat fare of Rs. 10 per trip. To empower youth yellow cab scheme was launched to provide a decent livelihood to the educated unemployed youth.

A self-employment scheme for unemployed skilled youth of Punjab was launched in 2011 with an initial capital of Rs. 1 billion. Short term (2 years) interest-free loans of up to Rs. 50,000 were given to skilled workforce encouraging them to become entrepreneurs. Additional funds were provided to this scheme to increase its reach to rural areas of Punjab.

The government announced comprehensive and long-term reform package for the empowerment of women in the social, economic and legal fields by providing them their legitimate rights and including them in the process of development and progress of the nation. Under the package, the condition and transfer of land, among heirs in rural areas has been waived to eliminate the possibilities of usurpation of ancestral property of women, provision of Form-B was made mandatory, 33% quota for women was fixed in all government institutions, commercial loans for women entrepreneurs worth Rs. 2 billion were issued.

Hostels were set up in various districts for working women. Vocational training was also being conducted by the Punjab Vocational Training Council. Centres were being established for protection of women from violence. Pink Motor Cycle was an initiative under Shehbaz Sharif government to provide motorbikes to women to make them independent in terms of transportation and mobility.

In this regard, Punjab government completed hundreds of IT projects in different departments which directly benefited the masses. Punjab government made possible access of youth to international computer companies. Pakistani youth would get opportunities of learning modern software programming in information and communication technology sectors which resulted in the development of local IT industry. The Punjab government launched an 'e-employment scheme' with the cooperation of Microsoft, for the students who have received laptops. Under this project various techniques of earning livelihood were imparted to the students through internet. Free Wi-Fi facility was provided to the students in educational institutions. Further, a great leap was taken by establishing state-of-the art forensic laboratory in Lahore to modernise the techniques of crime investigation.

Disaster Management

In the wake of natural disasters like Dengue outbreak, flash floods, and others, Mian Shehbaz Sharif has been labeled as a man of crisis who can fight and beat crisis with courage and untiring and nonstop working. The government of the Punjab started Khadim-e-Ala Relief Card for families of flood affected areas during 2012. The distribution of these relief cards was started on January 6, 2013 from Rajanpur. According to details, relief cards were distributed for 38,196 beneficiaries in Rajanpur, Jampur, Rojhan and Dera Ghazi Khan. The total amount disbursed is 763.92 million rupees. Shehbaz always stressed Provincial Disaster Management Authorities to cope with national calamities. There should be effective co-ordination between the NDMA and PDMA and better results could be achieved through the use of modern technology in disaster management. The Government of the Punjab assigned flood relief function to Rescue 1122 and empowered the Service by providing material resources. Likewise, under broad vision of the Chief Minister, Punjab, Rescue 1122 established special Urban Search & Rescue Teams at Divisional Level in Punjab to manage disasters. To combat unprecedented Dengue Epidemic of 2011, government mobilised all its resources and eventually succeeded in minimising the disease incidence. Strategies adopted under the guidance of national and international public health experts proved effective and resulted in curtailing the disease to a minimal level in subsequent years. All Government Departments were fully active for coping with dengue and due to vigorous awareness campaigns and the measures taken by the government; this fatal disease had been controlled.

Sports & Culture

Punjab government under the leadership of Chief Minister Punjab Shehbaz Sharif took revolutionary steps for the promotion of sports and spent millions of rupees for the purpose. Over 200 projects were completed and 22 hockey stadiums were upgraded. The Government of Punjab remained committed to provide best sports facilities to every sports lover and talented youth equally without any distinction. Punjab focused on uplifting the existing sports infrastructure in rural areas rather than the posh ones for the equal provision of sports activities among the public. To meet the future challenges, sports gymnasiums, playgrounds and Stadiums were also constructed in the remote areas to extend the sports among all the cities of Punjab. - Under this programme, 61 tehsils were identified having limited or no sports facilities where Tehsil Sports Complexes will be established. In Phase – I, 21 Tehsil Sports Complexes with an approved cost of Rs. 975.026 million were under constructed; Choa Saiden Shah, Chak Jhumra, Kabirwala, Taunsa, Pind Dadan Khan, Ahmadpur Sial, Hasilpur, Kot Adu, Bhera, Sargodha, Depalpur, Yazman, Chowk Azam District Layyah, Mianwali, SP Pakpattan, Chishtian, Isa Khail, Kehrur Pakka. Bahawalnagar, Jalalpur Jattan, Duniyapur and Liaquatpur.
- PSL was also started under the leadership of Shehbaz Sharif for the revival of International cricket in Pakistan.

Social Responsibility and Social Welfare

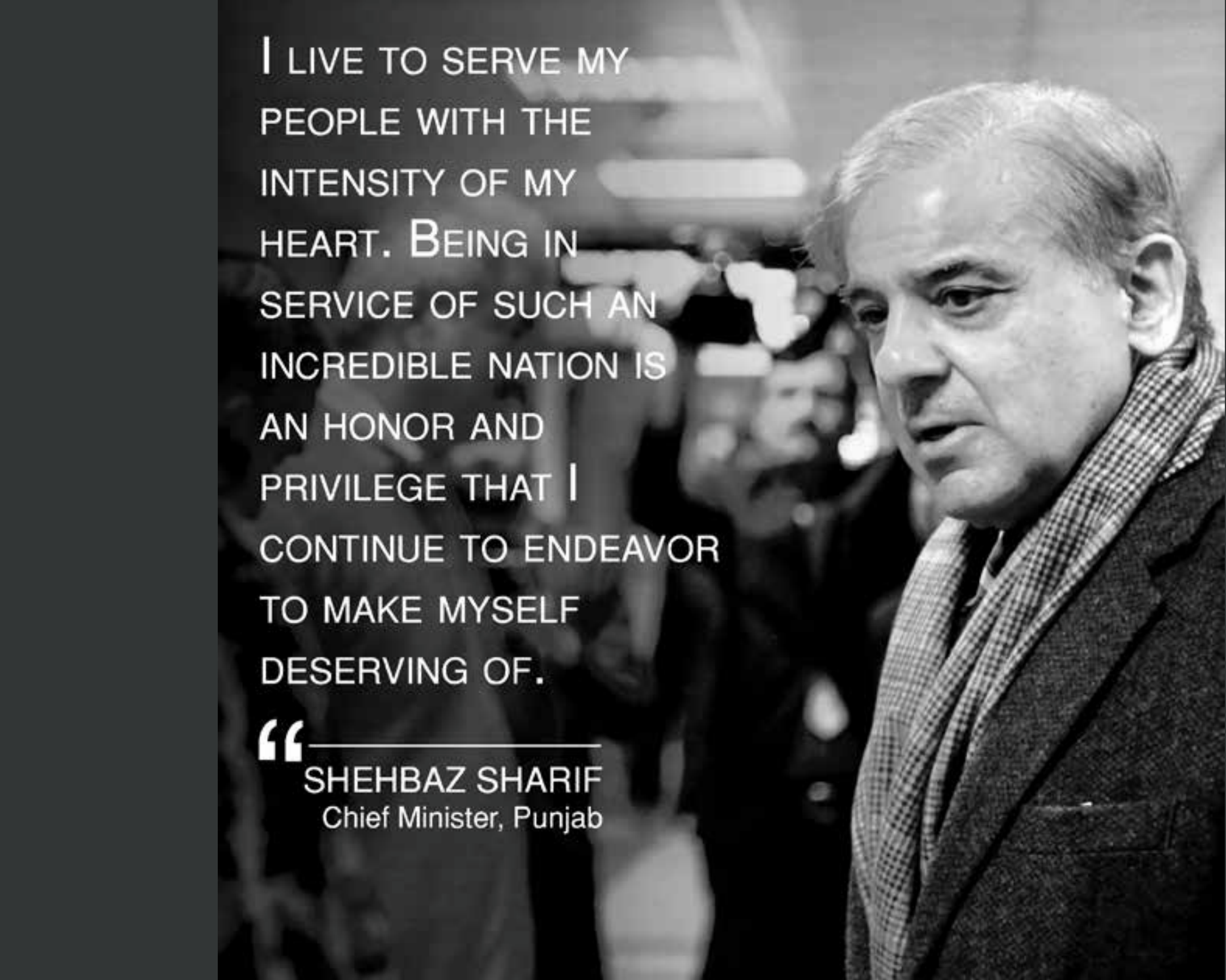
The progress made under Shehbaz in the affairs of Social Welfare and social welfare was a tough task as it challenged age-old traditional stereotypes. The Punjab government established ‘Gehwara’, a centre for newborn babies, in Multan where children will be nourished till the age of seven. Shehbaz established 420 vocational training institutes where people will acquire valuable skills enabling them to earn a living. The Punjab government set up a taskforce to fast-forward women’s empowerment agendas, including working closely with UN Women to create policy environment for women informal workers in the province. He launched Loan Scheme for Farmers without Interest; Self-Employment Scheme aimed at promoting self-reliance through utilization of skills. Interest-free loans worth 5.5 billion rupees were distributed under this scheme and 3.5 lacs families have benefited from this programme. Several schemes launched to provide health, housing and education facilities to labourers. Establishment of quality educational institutions for labourers’ children, social security hospitals and labour colonies is the proof of his labour-friendly policies. Khidmat Card programme was aimed at providing financial assistance to the disabled. More than 65,000 disabled people had been issued Khidmat Cards.

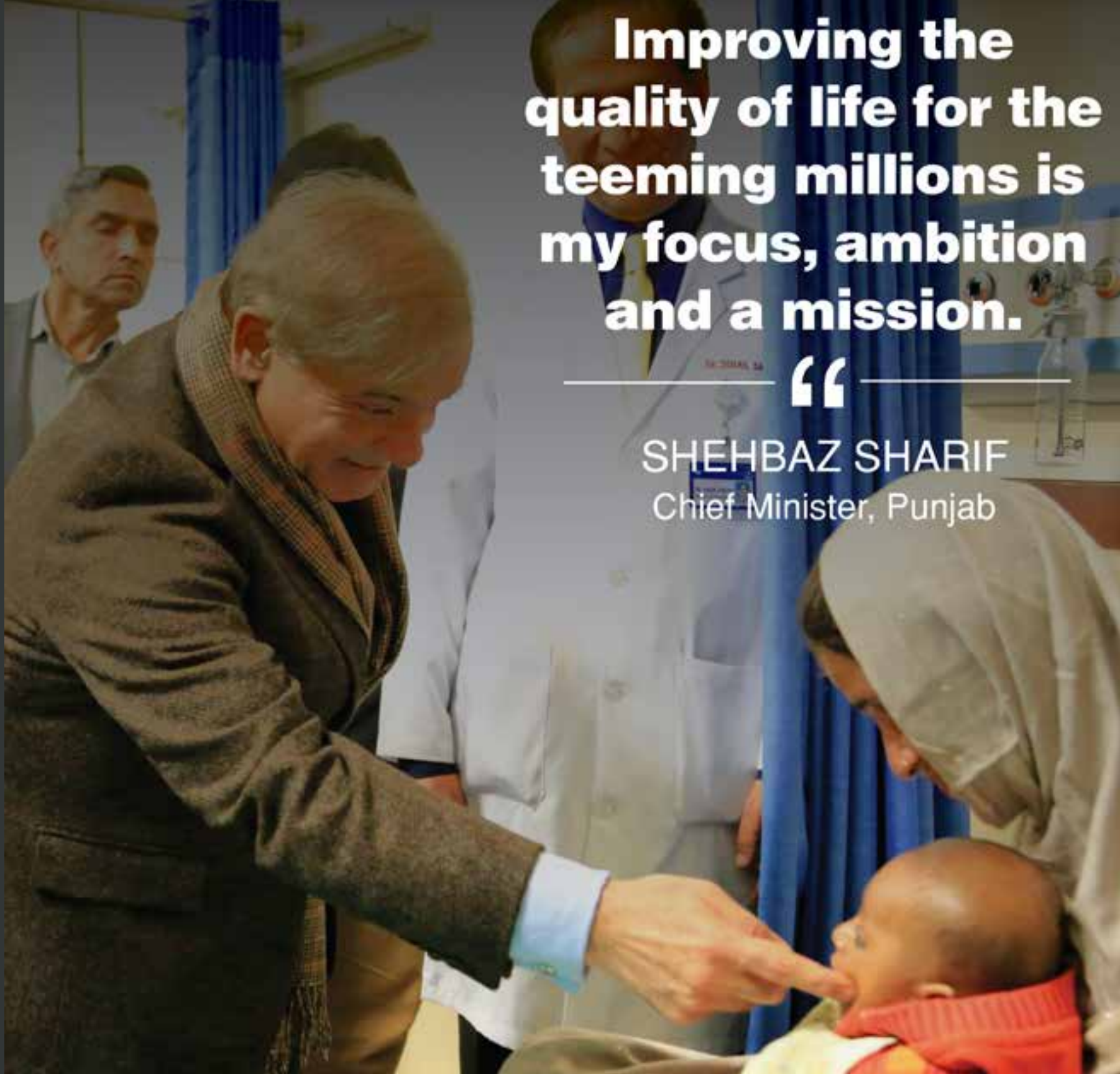

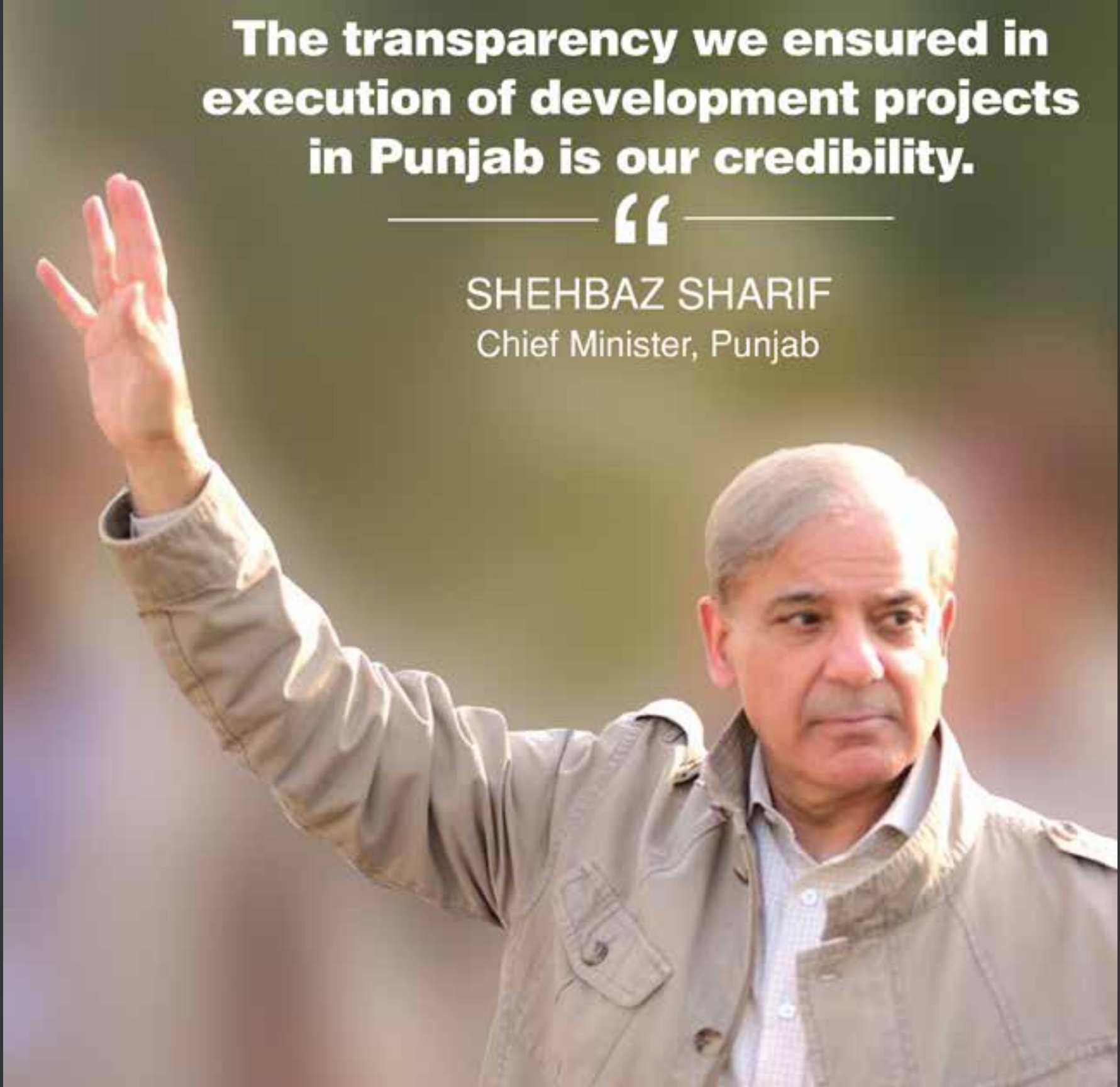
